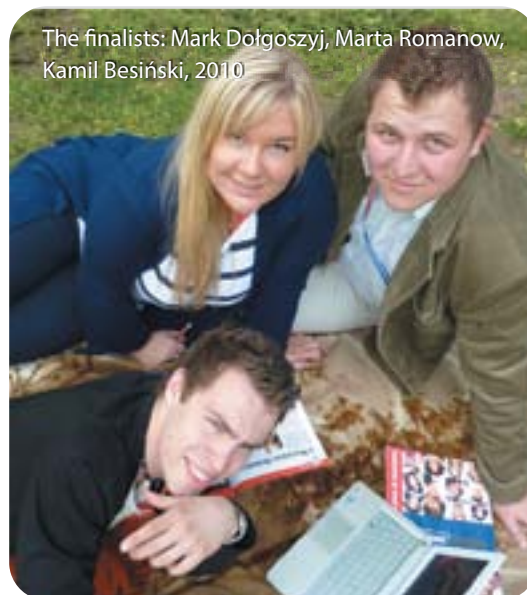
Successes of our students

Student's Nobel Prize and Primus Inter Pares (The first among equals)

Marta Romanow, a female student of Radom Academy of Economics (RAE) took second place in Mazovia Region in the contest for the most outstanding student – Primus Inter Pares (The first among equals) and came second in the national contest Student's Nobel Prize organized by the Independent Students' Association.

The contest of Primus Inter Pares is one of the most important undertakings of the students' fraternity in the country. It has been held since the mid-sixties of the XX century. This year marked the 41st edition of the contest. It is organized by the Polish Students' Association under the patronage of President of the Republic of Poland. Students of Radom Academy of Economics have been winning for the last six years in the regional edition of Primus Inter Pares contest. They can also boast of considerable successes at the country level. This year alone, the students listed below won in the sector-specific edition of the contest in the following categories: IT specialist - Marek Dołgoszyj, pedagogue – Marta Romanow, public relations – Katarzyna Woźniak, journalist - Katarzyna Romanowska.

Prestigious Scholarships of the Minister for students of RAE for the seventh time!

Twelve students of Radom Academy of Economics have been awarded with prestigious scholarships by the Minister of Science and Higher Education, prof. Barbara Kudrycka. The Minister awarded awards to students from all over Poland for their scientific and sporting achievements in the academic year 2011/2012. Students of RAE were amongst the best for the seventh time in a row. These results mean that Radom Academy of Economics ranks first in the ministerial ranking among all non-public universities in the country.

The scholarship programme of the Minister for outstanding scientific achievements is a special award, most of all a distinction for outstanding achievements in the field of science. Each year, they are awarded to students who excel in scientific activities, which include, among other things: conducting scientific research, being active in student research clubs and organizations, publishing their works in scientific publications. Points are assigned for completed internships or extra-curricular courses, certificates acknowledging the knowledge of foreign languages as well as foreign scholarship programmes completed. The requirement is also a very high average mark of min. 4.5 achieved through the whole academic year.

Students of RAE have been distinguished with Scholarships of the Minister for their academic performance already for the seventh time. RAE is the only university in Radom, can boast the scientific successes of its scholarship students on such scale: in 2005 – 4 scholarship students, 2006 – 7 scholarship students, 2007 – 8 scholarship students, 2008 – 9 scholarship students, 2009 – 13 scholarship students, 2010 – 20 scholarship students and in 2011 – 12 scholarship students.


The authorities

Educational resources and facilities in the city centre

At present, the facilities of Radom Academy of Economics offer the state-of-the-art educational infrastructure in Radom.

It enables students to gain knowledge in a comfortable manner using the latest technical solutions. At present, RAE owns a complex of 6 well-equipped buildings with a floor area of over 5,000 m². All facilities are situated in the city centre, in the vicinity of railway and coach stations, hotels, cinemas, clubs and restaurants. Lecture halls, classrooms and laboratories are equipped with the latest audio-visual and multimedia equipment of the following companies: Apple, IBM, Dell, JBL, Cisco, to name a few. All of these are supplemented with comfortable social infrastructure. At present, RAE campus boasts the largest and the best-equipped educational resources and facilities amongst all non-public universities in Radom Region.

It is the only university facility with over hundred years of tradition!

The building of Radom Academy of Economics situated at 61a Traugutta street is an exceptional structure in Radom. It was constructed in 1904 and has been associated with education since its very beginning. In 2001, the renovation executed by the Founder of the University has bestowed splendour to the building, which not only changed it from being in a state of dilapidation to a gem of the city-centre architecture, but also has provided a state-of-the-art teaching facility that continues the tradition of Radom's business education at a higher level for use by students.



BUILDING C

Building C at 61a Traugutta Street is a mixture of historic architecture and modern didactic unit. It is the headquarters of the Faculty of Humanities and the Faculty of Legal Sciences. There are lecture-halls, didactic rooms and computing laboratories. Building C is also a headquarters of the Chancellor of Radom Academy of Economics. There are also Finance Office, Stipends' Office, Career Office, International Relations Office, Postgraduate Studies Office, Dean's Office. Comfortable students' café with a wireless Internet access and CAFÉ GALLERY constitute great addition.



Primum lecture hall

This facility is a modern building commissioned in 2009, with its architecture having reference to Building C, where the Faculty of Humanities and the Faculty of Legal Sciences are both located. It houses a lecture hall with seating for over 300 persons, a spacious lobby and a reception. The lecture hall has been equipped with the highest quality multimedia and audio-visual equipment, which ensures high comfort for conducting lectures and classes and allows to apply cutting-edge teaching methods. Primum lecture hall has been professionally prepared for organizing symposiums, international conferences, lectures, debates and high-level meetings. It is located in the central core of Radom – it additionally affects its attractiveness and results in its being the most representative structure of this type in the city.

MAIN HALL

It is the largest Academy's main hall with over 320 seats. It is equipped with modern multimedia devices, which meet high didactic standards and provides a pleasant learning environment for all our students. It is also the place of important meetings, lectures and ceremonies. The Main Hall at 7a Domagalskiego Street is an integral part of the Building A.

BUILDING D

First of all, it is a Headquarter of the Academy's Authorities. There are a fully computerized library with a reading room and Rector's Office, Department of Didactic Organization.

Building B - a new location of the Faculty of Computer Science

In the academic year of 2010/2011 RAE extended its campus and expanded its educational facilities and resources. Through the efforts of the Founders of the University a new building located at 1a Staroopatowska street was commissioned in October 2010. The building is a new location for the Faculty of Computer Science as well as RAE Centre of Postgraduate Studies. Owing to its close proximity it forms part of the complex of buildings located at 7a Domagalskiego street.

Building B houses educational facilities of the Faculty of Computer Science and the Centre of Postgraduate Studies of RAE. It will provide a location for state-of-the-art computer classrooms equipped with best-in-class computer hardware, computer labs adapted for training of students to enable them to obtain specialised certificates as well as the highest-quality IT equipment. This building also houses the editorial office of Gazeta Radomska newspaper published by RAE.



The new building of Radom Academy of Economics at 1a Staroopatowska Street is the seat of the Faculty of Computer Science and provides all the teaching facilities for the postgraduate studies conducted by the university.



Modernly equipped laboratories, rooms and computer labs are located here, where, inter alia, students prepare to obtain specialized IT certifications



There are 21 iMac computers in the RAE computer lab running on the operating system specially designed for Intel multi-core processors and advanced graphics chips. Computer graphics, multimedia technology, programming and operating systems classes take place here.

RAE conducts computer classes using hardware of CISCO, which prepare students for working with large LANs and WANs as well as for CCNA exam certifying their knowledge and skills with respect to the management of routers and switches operating in a skeleton network.

The University participates in the MSDN Academic Alliance Programme, owing to which students of the Faculty of Computer Science have access to the latest software programmes of Microsoft. They can use the latest software programmes free of charge both at the university and at home.



BUILDING A

This modern didactic unit is located in the historic building at 7a Domagalskiego Street. It is the headquarters of the Faculty of Strategic and Security Studies. There are the Main Hall with a capacity of 320 and two lecture-rooms with a capacity of 130 each as well as Dean's Office, didactic rooms and computing laboratories. Students' café with a wireless Hot Spot internet access is also a place where CAFÉ GALLERY is situated.

Days for Dialogue of World Cultures

The Days for Dialogue of World Cultures is an ambitious cultural and educational project, which was implemented by on a grand scale in co-operation with the President of Radom under the honorary patronage of the Polish Committee for UNESCO. This time it was a spectacular event with an extensive programme that included, among other things: lectures, performances, exhibitions, tastings, ethnographic workshops, film screenings, concerts and others. This event was attended by representatives of embassies, groups of artists who specialise in music and dances from different parts of the world as well as travellers, ethnographers and other enthusiasts of world cultures. The two-day event ended with the performance of "Gloria" performed by Lviv's Theatre Woskresinje, which attracted many residents of Radom to Corazzi Square. The aesthetics of the performance was based on Ukrainian folklore. The Days for Dialogue of World Cultures is another event in the series of events that are annually prepared by RAE, which are aimed at bringing together cultures that permeate different regions of the world, presenting the traditions, styles, regional cuisine, cinema, languages, music, etc. An important purpose of these undertakings is to promote intercultural communication and to demonstrate the importance of diversity in today's global world.

African Days

African Days are an unusual cultural event aiming at presenting and promoting the culture, diversity and beauty of the African continent to the residents of Radom. They are also organised to draw students' and local people's attention to African problems and possibilities. African days are the first cultural event of this type in the region, which the Academy would like to continue and expand in the coming years. The event includes free photo and art exhibitions, concerts, African film festival and other attractions. African Days are held under the auspices of all the African Embassies in Poland. Day of Thailand

European Days Of Culture

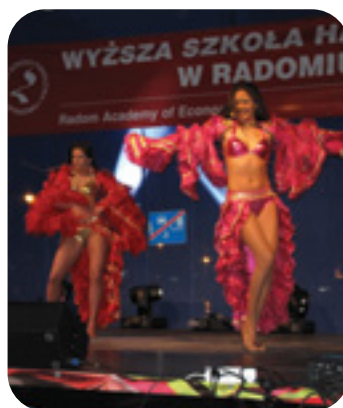

“Foto Odlot” Competition at RAE

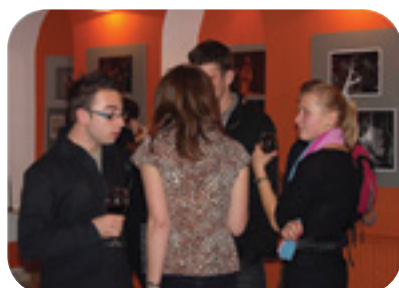

Time Of Blood

It is the title of charitable blood donation campaigns that are regularly organized by students of RAE in collaboration with the Regional Centre of Blood Donation and Blood Therapy in Radom. Under the headline “Time for Blood” students promote the ideas of blood donation and organize a blood donation drives at the campus.

Intimate summer film festival at RAE

RAE is a strategic partner of the National Polish Film Encounters “Intimate” Summer” film festival (Ogólnopolskie Spotkania Filmowe Kameralne Lato). It is an event that is a combination of a film festival with workshops for young persons, discussion panels, free film screenings as well as other innovative forms of artistic animation enabling practical intercourse with the art of filming. “Kameralne Lato” also involves organizing exhibitions, concerts, meetings with interesting people as well as happenings. Anna Mucha is the ambassador of the festival. It is indeed at RAE, among other places, where the invited representatives of the film and television industry conduct series of open lectures revealing the secrets of their profession and exposing other insider's information about the art of filming. Participants in the festival have the opportunity to gain practical knowledge of the filming with respect to the basics of directing, preparing the text of scenario, directing the lighting, staging of cinematic space, as well as acting, editing and post-production. Young people have the opportunity to set up a harmonious film crew and realize their own, original short film study.

Student Organization *Wolontariat*

Voluntary service „Wolontariat” of our Academy often takes part in various kinds of programs and initiatives including charity, help for instructional and custodian institutions, youth organizations, animal care associations or ecological organizations. „Wolontariat” organizes voluntary blood donations among the Academy's students every year.

Student debates

Inter-faculty and inter-university debates form part of the activities of the Student Self-governing Body and Student Research Clubs. Except for students of RAE representatives of other universities, youth organizations, representatives of social organizations as well as experts participate in them. The most recent debates concerned two controversial topics: “Do Poles form a tolerant society”? and “For or against the death penalty in the European Union”.

Cinemanía Students Film Club

The activities of the club involve promoting the art of filming among students of our university through organizing film screenings and interesting meetings relating to the theme of film making. This initiative brings together cinema and film enthusiasts alike, who by way of joint meetings wish to create opportunities for exchanging views as well as discussions. The Film Club participates in film festivals and collaborates with other student organizations.

Poetry encounters

It is an opportunity to showcase literary works of students of RAE, samples of their talent and gain valuable advice with respect to their writing skills. Poetry encounters are often combined with authors' evenings.

Student Organization *Biblión*

It is a club for book enthusiasts. They discuss new publications and popularize the idea of expanding knowledge through reading books. The club organizes „Evenings with Literature” or „Meetings with Books”, to which writers and publishers are invited. Going to all-Polish exhibitions of books is another interesting form of the activity of the club.

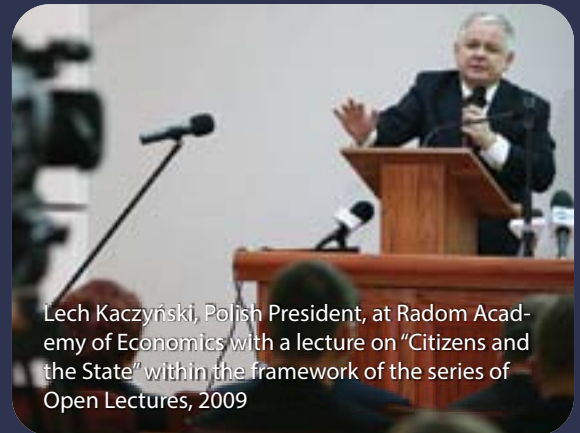

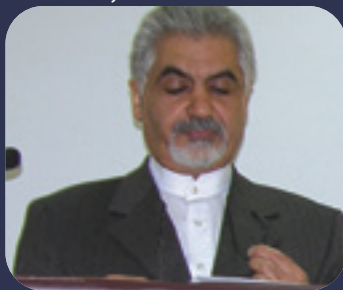

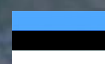

Winter Term

Concept

The curriculum of the English path was prepared in order to provide students with the necessary knowledge and practical skills in decision-making in diverse conditions of the international market environment. The path realised in this scope is extremely valuable and useful for students because of its interdisciplinary and multi-dimensional approach to analysis of contemporary problems of businesses and economic environment. Currently, many foreign companies and state institutions are in need for specialists in international business that is why, Radom Academy of Economics places an emphasis on the close integration of theoretical and practical knowledge as well as preparation for professional work gained during workshops.

Objectives

The English Path "International Business in Global Economy" is primarily aimed at providing the students with knowledge and skills needed in doing business internationally and prepare them to work in companies operating in the EU and global economic space. In addition, by taking part in the programme students can acquire knowledge of cultural differences, international relations which enables them to understand the issues of the modern world better, analyze the environment and notice the interconnections among economic units. The programme helps them to learn rules for running businesses, ensuring effectiveness of the market as well as creating and implementing business plans. Students will find out about the functioning of the global and European market, including competition rules, procedures related to the movement of goods across borders. They will also learn how to carry out analyses and evaluate the situation on international markets.

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS IN THE GLOBAL ECONOMY

- this is an Interdisciplinary Educational Path for winter semester, which includes courses:

1. Cultural aspects of international business - 4 ECTS

In an era of globalization, marketing is a management discipline that must be conducted in co-operation with people of different cultural backgrounds or be tailored to the needs of such diverse people. Continuously, marketing managers need to be able to function within and across national cultures. This is arguably, especially so within the defence sector. Therefore, awareness and understanding of culture is a key skill for international marketing managers. The aim of this course is to improve students' awareness of the cultural dimension of conducting business internationally, increase sensitivity to issues concerning national culture and cultural overlap/conflict and explore methods and techniques for managing the marketing function in an objective and useful manner, within culturally diverse settings.

2. Competition Policy - 3 ECTS

The aim of the course is to cover economic concepts and method of analysis relevant for anti-monopoly policies of state and supranational institutions, explains the main statutes of related legislation and discuss possibilities economic analysis in practical enforcement on concrete cases on national as well on supranational levels with active participation of students. Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to understand main institutions of anti-monopoly policies including possible conflicts. The course provides student with arguments useful for their future carrier.

3. Currency and Financial Crises - 4 ECTS

The global financial crisis of 2007-2009 was the most severe since the Great Depression. Understanding this crisis and the responses of central banks and other authorities will help business decision-makers and investors assess financial opportunities and risks in normal times. International comparisons during the current crisis will be used to illuminate these key issues. Comparison and contrast with past crises and policy actions also will play an important role.

4. Current Issues of European and Global Economy - 4 ECTS

The aim of the program is to introduce students the EU preference formation on foreign economic policies, strategies and tactics in international economic negotiations also they will study what role does the EU play in international economic organizations, such as the World Trade Organization? How does it interact with other international economic organizations, standard-setting organizations such as Codex Alimentarius and the Basle Committee on Banking Supervision, and plurilateral clubs such as the G7/G8? This course also introduces and describes last financial crisis and it influence of European and Global Economy.

5. Human Resources Management on the International market - 4 ECTS

This course is based on the fundamental premises that the major role of HRM is to provide organizations with the foundations and information that they need to increase strategic advantage and to improve

operational efficiency. The quality of the organization's employees, their enthusiasm and satisfaction with their jobs, their experiences and sense of fair treatment all affect the firm's productivity, customer service, reputation and survival. Although there will not be many students in this course become HR specialists, virtually all will have to work with other people. Dealing with people is a process of organizational life, regardless of what position they are in; accounting, finance, marketing, international business or some other areas. Apparently, every manager is a human resource manager. It is important for managers in all departments to functionally confront HR issues daily. Thus, this course aims to prepare students who plan to manage others at sometime in their careers.

6. International Commercial Law - 4 ECTS

This module focuses on international law, extending the institutional coverage of module 550.1 to include general treaties of international law, such as the GATT, WTO, and related agreements relevant to trade and investment; specific trade laws; case histories; and dispute settlement procedures. It will familiarize students with the nature and structure of international rights and obligations in the field of international trade and investment, the relationship between domestic (municipal) law and international rules and obligations, the nature of international trade agreements, and the main contours of substantive obligations in the trade and investment field. Students identify how such rules and obligations can – or cannot – help to resolve specific problems relating to international trade and investment.

7. International Marketing - 4 ECTS

This course will present an overview of the unique aspects of marketing in the international business environment and provide the framework upon which multinational marketing management can be based. Emphasis will be placed on the role of the international marketing manager in the development of marketing strategies for a variety of markets in diverse cultural, political and economic situations. Focus will be on the decision making process in the areas of foreign market analysis, target identification, product planning, promotion and channels of distribution. The global objective of this course is to provide students with the necessary knowledge and tools to develop marketing strategies for a variety of markets in diverse cultural, political and economic situations.

8. Modern Economic Systems - 4 ECTS

Comparative economic systems is the study of the effects of economic systems on observed outcomes, i.e., economic performance and welfare. Thus, our goal will be to attempt both theoretical and empirical (case study) investigations to determine the relative effects of the various systems. This will not be easy, for economic outcomes are determined by many other things (stage of economic development, income, politics, climate, geography, customs and traditions, etc.), as well. We will study three economic systems: capitalism, planned socialism, and market socialism and will analysis the countries most representative of these systems.

9. Polish for beginners - 4 ECTS

The objective of Polish language course is to acquire communication skills in Polish in the area of vocabulary and general subjects at different competence levels – from very beginners to highly advanced. The programme promotes the introduction to Polish language through active teaching in the office and social environment, as well as familiarizing foreigners with lifestyle in Poland, with a focus on cultural differences. The course is divided into modules dedicated to the subjects selected through the analysis of the needs of participants and recommended by the teacher. Apart from developing speaking and listening skills the participants practice writing and reading skills, depending on the objectives. The participants take part in exercises, write tests and final exam based on the basis of which the teacher prepares a recommendation for every participant on further learning stage.

10. The Globalization of the Economy - 4 ECTS

In this course, students will examine globalization, its many facets, complexities, paradoxes, controversies, and effects. The institutions that dominate the global economic system will be emphasized, especially as these affect the mission and work of the church. Students will discuss and critique the ideology that supports economic globalization, consider alternative models of global society, and consider strategies for educating congregations and equipping them for action.

11. Trends in the Global Economy - 3 ECTS

In this course we will study the global economy from the perspectives of both economic theory and real world evidence. In order to understand the way in which the global economy works we need a solid foundation in the theory of international trade in goods and services and the theory of international exchange of assets. Broadly speaking, international trade develops the micro theoretic foundations of global economy study while international finance supports the macro theory underlying our examination of the global economy.

Spring Term

Concept

The program will enable students to gain knowledge on international processes during which the individual countries form joint mechanisms and institutions equipped with the powers that were previously in the competence of the state. Integration of the European Union embodies the vision of humanity and a model of society with a special attitude to the rich heritage of values. Members of the European Union as a whole, rather than the sum of components, take the challenge of globalization to have a better impact on economic, social, technological, commercial, political and legal issues. Students will acquire a thorough knowledge of European integration with a focus on social and legal aspects of such a phenomenon as the European Union.

Objectives

The aim of the program is to introduce students to the sources of nature and dynamics of basic, legal, social and partially cultural processes related to the European integration. Students will have the opportunity to gain knowledge and assess the European integration in terms of positive and negative legal and social aspects. Our goal is to enable students to gain a general understanding of interdisciplinary social science and to use it at work and in life with the principles of ethics. The main purpose is to enable students to analyze social and political processes taking place in the global, regional, state and local scale, as well as get acquainted with the economic and legal principles underlying the organization and functioning of modern societies. The student should know the history of Europe, the conditions for its integration, as well as the genesis of laws and principles operating in the European Union.

LEGAL AND SOCIAL ASPECTS OF EUROPEAN INTEGRATION

- this is an Interdisciplinary Educational Path for winter semester, which includes courses:

1. Corporate Social Responsibility in the European Union - 4 ECTS

The course aims to develop student's general theoretical knowledge of Corporate Social Responsibility in contemporary organizations and understanding of Corporate Social Responsibility an evolving management practice. The course will cover the following subject areas: Theories of Corporate Social Responsibility; The development of Corporate Social Responsibility; Methods for analyzing conceptual foundations of Corporate Social Responsibility in contemporary businesses and organizations.

2. Democracy in Europe - 4 ECTS

This course introduces students to the theoretical debate on democracy and its transformations in Europe, both at nation state and supra-national levels. Moreover, it addresses the issue of democracy promotion in failed and failing states, with a specific focus on the dynamics currently undergoing in the EU near abroad also presents the main trends of democratic transformations in Europe from an institutional perspective, also by highlighting divergences and similarities with the developments taking place in the United States. In this context, centrality is given to the idea of the EU and US as converging "compound democracies". The course aims to develop students' familiarity with practices of international state building and multilateral projects for the consolidation of democratic and good governance practices in post-conflict scenarios. In particular, emphasis is attached to the following issues: sovereignty in international relations, the EU integration process, democracy promotion and human rights policies in complex post-conflict reconstruction projects, EU enlargement and reconciliation policies in fractured multiethnic societies.

3. European Law - 3 ECTS

The purpose of this course is to provide an overview of European Union law with a particular emphasis on competition law. It will cover the history, institutions and fundamental freedoms (e.g., free movement of persons and goods) as well as competition and merger control law. It will review the underlying treaty law as well as the case law and the secondary legislation of the EU. The topics to be discussed are: history of EU, institutions, freedoms, policies and issues, anti-competitive arrangements, abuse of dominance, merger control, sources of European law.

4. Institutions and European Union Sources - 4 ECTS

This course aims to familiarize students with the main institutions of the European Union and how they interact to form a political system. The course starts with the theoretical debate about the nature of the European Union. Then, it introduces the EU institutions and decision-making discussing executive, legislative and judicial politics. Finally, it analyses the role of citizens in the EU system. On completion of the course, students will have acquired a knowledge of the basic theories of European integration, of the main political processes and politicization of the EU and they will be able to critically analysis and understand how the EU is

functioning as a political system. Also, the students will have acquired knowledge of three sources of European Union law: primary law, secondary law and supplementary law. That means that they will be educated about Treaties establishing the EU, legal instruments based on the Treaties, conventions, agreements and elements of law not provided for by the Treaties. This category includes Court of Justice case-law, international law and general principles of law.

5. Intercultural Communication in Europe - 4 ECTS

The main objective of this course is to provide students from different countries and background insight in the knowledge of intercultural communication through language. The course deals with analysis of communication and its influence on and by culture in its broadest sense. It includes particular areas of behavior and communications EU inhabitants. Students will talk and confront with similarities and differences between basic values, lifestyles, models of consumption, cultural standards, etc.

6. Migration in European Union-problem or solution for labour market - 4 ECTS

The main goal of the course is to provide theoretical basis, rules and aspects of migration policy in EU countries. Migration can cause problems for both the immigrants and the people who are already living in the area. These problems can include clashes of culture, lack of jobs, difficulty in understanding technology for immigrants, language barriers, and ethical differences. The focus point of the given course will be analysis of migration processes and draw attention to the opportunities and challenges posed by migration.

7. Regional Policy in the European Union - 3 ECTS

The main goal of the course is to provide theoretical basis, rules and aspects of regional policy and regional development in EU countries. The course will get students familiar with idea of European Union regional policy and its evolution, institutions, mechanisms and financing. Essential part of the course will be focusing on contemporary problems of EU regional policy, differences and priorities. The focal point of the given course will be analysis of regional management processes and survey of good practices. Goals of the course: understanding of EU regional policy rules and basis, obtaining knowledge of regional policy instruments, ability to indicate factors of regional development, ability to compare and value conducted regional policy and its effects.

8. Security Problems in the European Union - 4 ECTS

The main purposes of this course is to familiarize students with key security problems in international relations (from theoretical and practical perspective). We will discuss on security strategies such as alliances, balance of power, collective security, deterrence, and on perspectives on security (critical theory, neoliberals etc.), and also the role of great powers and third world security. We will also try to discuss on proliferation, environmental security, population (societal security) and terrorism.

9. Social aspects of Integration Processes in Europe - 4 ECTS

This course introduces students to the relevant information concerning the functioning of contemporary Europe. This course covers concepts associated with the notions and tenets connected with the functioning of the United Europe. Students will learn about the selected elements of the European history, about the selected elements of political theories of international relation and about different cultures of Europe. We will also try to discuss the issues connected with the contemporary societies of Europe and to discuss the issue of intercultural.

10. Stereotyping and Prejudice in the European Union - 4 ECTS

This course focuses on the social psychology of stereotyping, prejudice, and discrimination. In other words, we will examine the phenomena and processes associated with one's beliefs about members of social groups (stereotypes), attitudes and evaluative responses toward group members (prejudice), and behaviors toward members of a social group based on their group membership (discrimination). Also, we will study how these issues shape the experiences of social group members, especially when they are members of low-status and/or minority groups. In order to explore these topics, we will primarily focus on large societal groups that differ on dimensions of identity such as race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, and religion.

11. The European Union as an Entity of the Global Economy - 4 ECTS

The course contents: global and international position of the EU in the world: state and future, evaluation of transatlantic relations of the UE: USA - EU, eastern Partnership of the EU: plans and challenges, progress in bilateral relations EU - Russia (since y.1991), Mediterranean Economic Area: history and present state, BRIC countries as partners of the EU, Western Balkan - EU progress in relations, prospects for new enlargement of the EU.

12. Polish for beginners - 4 ECTS

The objective of Polish language course is to acquire communication skills in Polish in the area of vocabulary and general subjects at different competence levels – from very beginners to highly advanced. The programme promotes the introduction to Polish language through active teaching in the office and social environment as well as familiarizing foreigners with lifestyle in Poland, with a focus on cultural differences. The course is divided into modules dedicated to the subjects selected through the analysis of the needs of participants and recommended by the teacher. Apart from developing speaking and listening skills the participants practice writing and reading skills, depending on the objectives. The participants take part in exercises, write tests and final exam based on the basis of which the teacher prepares a recommendation for every participant on further learning stage.

The course particularly draws attention to the problems of running an individual enterprise. Thanks to that, graduates will have learnt how to run an own company, develop creativity and be open to changes. Another decisive factor in achieving success on the job market is instilling in students effective skills of managing the communication sector with a particular focus put on public relations activities that help to improve an image of the company. The course embraces such modules as Organizational Behavior, Public Relations in Organization, Public Relations Materials and Texts, Consumer Relationship Management, Company Marketing Communication System. The course exposes students to a wide range of tutorials, workshops, and seminars, thanks to which students will have opportunities to solve problems individually, cooperate with each other, use different sources of information, combine and shape existing knowledge, organize and evaluate own and other's work, prepare business projects, give presentations and provide written assignments connected with specific issues, engage in new challenges as well as do different jobs.

Career Prospects

The course prepares to realize essential management functions in enterprises of different ownership types and different organizational and legal forms, public administration sectors (both governmental and self-governmental), non-profit organizations, institutions of the European Union, and national security organizations. Information technology

The concept of studies

The engineering degree programme in Information Technology is conducted in English and lasts three and a half year. Information Technology is a field of study that grows rapidly and dynamically creating new challenges and opportunities for progress. Most of the present occupations require the basic command of computer knowledge. One in four new workplaces in the EU (European Union) are created in the field of telecommunication, the Internet, information technology and computer science. The Information Technology course embraces knowledge and expertise as well as shaping practical skills in the area of computer programmes and systems. The programme of Information Technology is designed so that students can gain skills in the field of construction and operation of the components of information systems according to market requirements, the administration of a medium-sized systems, the creation and management of web services and the management of information technology projects. Classes of Information Technology are carried out according to the teaching programme that has been prepared in close cooperation with leading IT companies. It should be emphasized that all classes are taught by professionals with extensive practical experience and based on the illustrative methods of lecture and laboratory classes using modern hardware and software. Laboratory classes are held in small groups. During the classes in the computer labs, each student has at its disposal a separate computer. Students in their 2nd and 3rd year of studies use a lab equipped with the latest specialized computers tailored to the subject of their thesis.

The young computer engineer will be employed not only in specialized companies engaged in the generation, protection, implementation and maintenance of information systems, but also in the various sectors of the economy - industry, business, government, IT services, as well as research and educational institutions. The graduate may find employment as a designer and software developer, a researcher, an administrator of complex information systems and computer networks, a specialist in information systems security or might take on other positions related to the computerization of business or office.

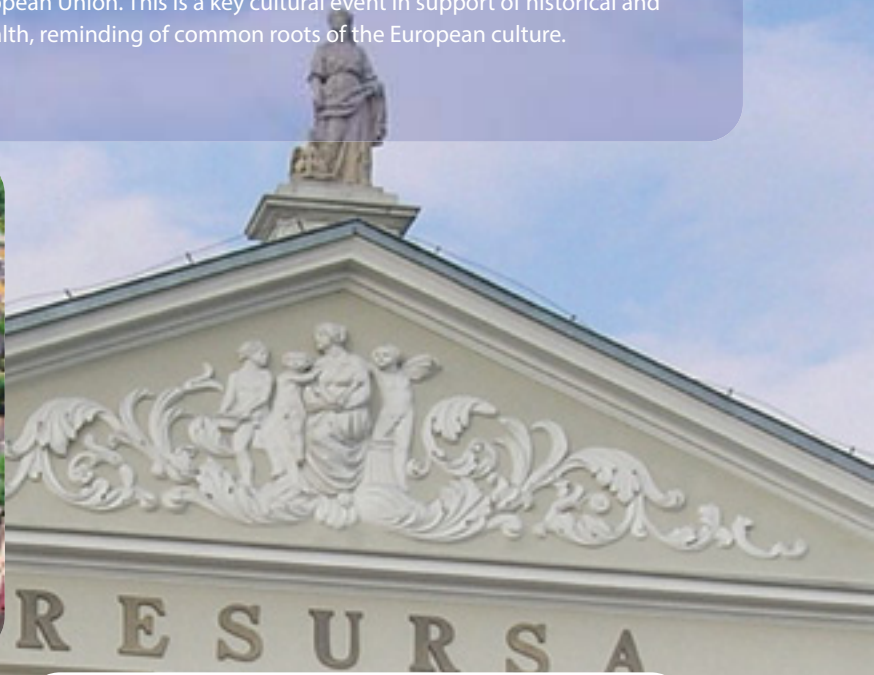

The history and emblem of Radom

Radom culture has rich traditions, relating primarily to the people who created it and to a number of cultural institutions, associations, music and dance ensembles. Municipality of Radom administers nine local cultural institutions: Jan Kochanowski Popular Theatre, Józef A. and Andrzej S. Załuski Municipal Public Library, 'Resursa' Arts and Culture Community Centre, Municipal Community Centre 'Amphitheatre', Creative Club 'Łażnia' (Bath-House), Municipal Centre of Culture and International Exchange, 'Borki' and 'Idalin' Community Centres, and Radom Chamber Orchestra, established 2007. There are more than 30 cultural societies, associations and foundations in the city, with the most active: Musical Society, Civic Committee for Preservation of Radom Historical Monuments, Radom Scientific Society, 'Burning Brand' Literary Group, Radom Photographic Society, Radom Branch of the Polish Society of Graphic Artists, Ars Antiqua Radomiensis Foundation, Civic Committee for Protection of the Historical Roman Catholic Cemetery, Theatrical Culture Society, Nicolaus of Radom Foundation. The annual Radom Days, Bread Festival, Christmas on the Main Street, and the cycle of Sunday concerts 'Let's Meet at Żeromskiego Street' are important cultural events organised by the City Hall to integrate all groups, cultural institutions, and arts movements. Radom actively celebrates the European Heritage Days 24 initiated by the Council of Europe and promoted by the European Union. This is a key cultural event in support of historical and cultural education, promoting regional heritage in all its wealth, reminding of common roots of the European culture.

Operations of Jacek Malczewski Museum, located in the overhauled building of the former Piarist College, are internationally renowned. The museum collects and stores archeological, literary, historical, and arts resources of Polish culture, including works by amateur artists and artists working abroad, as well as numismatic, medal, phaleristic, sphragistic and nature collections. The Contemporary Art Museum, based in the historic Gaska and Esther house, is a branch of Jacek Malczewski Museum. This small institution stages a number of interesting individual and group exhibitions of Polish and foreign artists, and collects works by prominent contemporary artists, painters, and sculptors. Collections of the Contemporary Art Museum are among the most interesting nationally, including, among others, works by Alfred Lenica, Artur Nacht – Samborski, Jerzy Nowosielski, Jan Tarasin.

Mazovian Centre of Contemporary Art 'Power Plant' is being set up in the historical former building of the municipal power plant. The idea for the Centre originated from Andrzej Wajda – a Honorary Citizen of Radom. Andrzej Wajda and Krystyna Zachwatowicz have for many years sponsored the Contemporary Art Museum, donating paintings by, among other artists, Józef Czapski, Ryszard Horowitz, Tadeusz Kantor, as well as Wajda's juvenilia.

Poland

General information

Poland - officially - the Republic of Poland (Polish: Rzeczpospolita Polska) is a country in Central Europe, bordered by Germany to the west; the Czech Republic and Slovakia to the south; Ukraine, Belarus and Lithuania to the east; and the Baltic Sea and Kaliningrad Oblast, a Russian exclave, to the north.

The total area of Poland is making it the 69th largest country in the world and the 9th largest in Europe. Poland has a population of over 38 million people, which makes it the 34th most populous country in the world and the sixth most populous member of the European Union.



Poland is a democracy, with a president as a head of state, whose current constitution dates from 1997. The government structure centers on the Council of Ministers, led by a prime minister. The president appoints the cabinet according to the proposals of the prime minister, typically from the majority coalition in the Sejm. The president is elected by popular vote every five years. The current president is Bronisław Komorowski.

Poland is the sixth most populous member state of the European Union and, ever since joining in 2004, has pursued policies to increase its role in European affairs. Poland has a grand total of 51 representatives in the European Parliament and in addition to this, since 14 July 2009, former Prime Minister of Poland Jerzy Buzek, has been President of the European Parliament. Poland is the only European economy to have avoided the late-2000s recession.



There are currently 14 heritage sites inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage list in Poland. The most attractive urban destinations for tourists are Warsaw, Kraków, Wrocław, Poznań, Lublin and Toruń; in addition to these the historic site of the Auschwitz concentration camp near Oświęcim is a noteworthy place of pilgrimage and a now constitutes a major monument to the prevention of war and suffering in Southern Poland. Popular areas of natural beauty include northeast Poland's Masurian Lake District and Białowieża Forest. Poland's main tourist offerings are thought to be based around city-sightseeing and extra-urban historical monuments, business trips, qualified tourism, agrotourism, and mountain hiking, among others.

The Polish language, part of the West Slavic branch of the Slavic languages, functions as the official language of Poland.

The education of Polish society was a goal of rulers as early as the 12th century, and Poland soon became one of the most educated countries in Europe.
